The theme issue is scheduled for **June 22-Sept. 20, 2014**. We seek to publish articles from all regions of the globe.

Earthzine seeks to explore the application of scientific and technological research as well as policy and its implementation for the benefit of society. We welcome articles about programs, projects, organizations, examples of interdisciplinary and/or cross-regional research latest discoveries, and unusual findings. We also publish opinion essays, and book and art reviews. Submissions must be in English.
